

Kilkenny County Council Road Traffic Special Speed Limit Bye – Laws 2023

Introduction;

This report has been prepared for submission to the elected members of Kilkenny County Council and contains information regarding the preparation of the Speed limit Bye Laws for 2023

The report details the process undertaken, the number of submissions and objections received, during the public display period for of special speed limit Bye Laws Draft A and Maps for County Kilkenny in accordance with Section 9.4 of the Road Traffic Act 2004.

Local Authorities are mandated to review speed Limits every 5 years. The last review in County Kilkenny was carried out in 2017. Whilst the review included both National and Non National Roads the decision for speed limits on National Roads rests entirely with transport Infrastructure Ireland. A part of the 2017 Speed Limits Bye Laws a review of National Road speed limits was carried out by Consultants on behalf of TII. This process was not repeated by TII for the 2023 Bye Laws

Notice of Changes to Special speed Limit Bye Laws.

Draft A bye laws and maps were on public display on Consult.ie, along with hard copies at each of the area offices, County and City Hall from Friday the 6^{th} May to the 10^{th} June 2022.

A notice describing the proposed changes was placed in the Kilkenny People week ending 6th May 2022.

The proposed changes and additions to the Draft A Bye-laws is consistent with the guidelines for setting and managing speed limits in Ireland March 2015 edition. These Guidelines, having regard to section 9(9) of the 2004 Road Traffic Act, constitute a direction of the Minister for Transport. Their purpose is to provide guidance to local authorities, and other practitioners, in making bye-laws in relation to the setting of speed limits in Ireland.

Submissions Received

Kilkenny County Council received 64 number submissions during the public consultation period, 41 submissions on consult.ie, 23 number submissions by post by email. Appendix A attached is a Schedule of submissions / objections received along with comments / recommendations for same.

Review of Submissions

The submissions were reviewed and where proposed changes and additions to the Draft A Bye-laws were consistent with the guidelines for setting and managing speed limits in Ireland March 2015 edition were included. These Guidelines, having regard to section 9(9) of the 2004 Road Traffic Act, constitute a direction of the Minister for Transport. Their purpose is to provide guidance to local authorities, and other practitioners, in making bye-laws in relation to the setting of speed limits in Ireland.

Conclusion and recommendation;

received during the display for public inspection of special speed limit Bye

Laws Draft A and Maps for County Kilkenny, in accordance with Section 9(.4)

of the Road Traffic Act 2004.

These Draft Bye-Laws have now been updated to Kilkenny County Council

Road Traffic Special Speed Limit Bye-Laws 2023 and are attached to this report

for adoption by the Elected Members of Kilkenny County Council under

Section 9.10 of the Road Traffic Act 2004.

These Bye - Laws may be cited as the Kilkenny County Council Road Traffic

Special Speed Limit Bye-Laws 2023 and shall come into operation on the 1st

January 2024, while at the same time revoking the Kilkenny County Council

Road Traffic Speed Limit Bye - Laws 2017.

In Conclusion I recommend that Kilkenny County Council resolves to adopt

the Special Speed Limit Bye - Laws 2023 with a commencement date of Friday

the 1st January, 2024.
